


2017 Giving-At-A-Glance

- The Adams Street 2-1 Employee Matching Gift Program gave to more than 50 global organizations in 2017.
- In recognition of employees who serve on boards or invest significant volunteer time with an organization, the firm made several additional grants to non-profits.
- Gifts made through employee-driven initiatives accounted for more than 40% of Adam Street's 2017 charitable giving.

Doctors Without Borders

In 2017, Adams Street made a year-end gift to Doctors Without Borders on behalf of our clients. We chose Doctors Without Borders because of their impact on the communities around the globe. DWB was founded in France in 1971 as “Medecins Sans Frontieres”, in response to a growing need in the medical community to help people suffering during and after major disasters. Their fundamental values remain simple: they believe that all people have a right to medical care regardless of gender, race, religion, creed or political affiliation, and that the needs of these people outweigh respect for national boundaries.
